

Furthermore, the Golden Oldies opening ceremony will take place the day after Edinburgh's spectacular annual fireworks display.

the festival programme

This outline programme gives a flavour of the activities that are planned for you. Please note that unexpected circumstances in the two-year period leading to the Festival may affect the final plans.

Festival Starts

Pre-Festival Day Sunday, 31 August

• The opportunity to enjoy the spectacular Bank of Scotland Fireworks Concert, the largest annual fireworks concert in Europe choreographed to the music of the Scottish Chamber Orchestra. Each year this is one of the most spectacular displays anywhere in the world.

Day 1 Monday, 01 September

- Arrival of teams in Edinburgh and meeting & greeting (unless you have come earlier to experience some of the Edinburgh Festivals such as The Edinburgh International Festival, The Military Tattoo, The International Film Festival, The International Book Festival, The Jazz Festival (to name a few).
- Team Managers' and Referees briefings to be held at Murrayfield Stadium.
- In the evening, all participants will gather at Edinburgh Castle for the Opening Ceremony and civic welcome. The Parade of Nations will then wind its way down the Royal Mile to The Meadows for the 17th Festival Welcome Party.

Day 2 Tuesday, 02 September

- · First day of games at Murrayfield and Saughton Park.
- Optional packages will be available; perhaps a visit to Holyrood House or a visit to Edinburgh's famous department stores – Jenners or Harvey Nichols.



Day 3 Wednesday, 03 September

'Highland Fling' Day Out. Join us in a unique setting. Ratho - the world's largest indoor climbing arena - and some outdoors (weather permitting) for an afternoon of traditional and non-traditional Scottish fun. All whilst enjoying a "Taste of Scotland" food and drink.

Day 4 Thursday, 04 September

• Second games day at Murrayfield and Saughton Park.

Optional sight-seeing packages will be available e.g a tour of one of Scotland's world renowned whisky distilleries.



Day 5 Friday, 05 September

Day 6 Saturday, 06 September

the Festival packages

The accommodation packages and local packages are essential for a successful Festival. They ensure you and your team are involved in all aspects during the week, getting full value and sharing the spirit of 'Fun, Friendship and Fraternity''.

Scottish teams resident within 100km of Edinburgh will be entitled to take a special local package but do have the option of booking an accommodation package with transfers also included. If that option is preferred it will be necessary to have accommodation booked through the ground operator, Gullivers Sports Travel so transport to the grounds and social functions can be co-ordinated.

Teams from outside Scotland must purchase an Accommodation Package.

all teams registering for the Festival will be entitled to:

- Three days of Rugby at Murrayfield and/or Saughton Parks.
- Participation in the Opening Ceremony at Edinburgh Castle and Parade of Nations.
- · Festival 'Survival Guide'.
- Three editions of the Festival newspaper.
- Team Managers' briefing meeting attendance.
- An invitation to the Team Managers to attend a cocktail function.

visitors' accommodation packages will also include:

- Seven nights accommodation. Your team chooses the level and category of accommodation it wants hotel, hostel, apartment, university.
- A cooked breakfast every morning in hotels, university and hostels. Continental buffet breakfast in the Ibis Hotel. Breakfast not provided in apartments.
- Meeting, greeting and welcome upon arrival.
- Airport transfers for all teams. One team transfer per team in and out.
- Return coach transfers to all three social functions

Please note: If you want to take the opportunity to attend any part of the Edinburgh Festival immediately preceding the Golden Oldies Festival this can be booked for you by the Air New Zealand agent in the UK, Gullivers Sports Travel, but any costs are extra to the Golden Oldies-week package prices.

Please also be aware that Edinburgh is in huge demand over the period of its Festival and hotels will be harder to come by and more expensive than for our Golden Oldies event. We urge you to book soon to secure accommodation for an early arrival in Edinburgh.

your entry guide

Registration: The official entry form attached to this brochure is required to be completed and accompanied by the entry fee of UKL 150 payable to the "2008 Golden Oldies World Rugby Festival". The entry fee may also be paid by credit card (VISA or MasterCard only) or transferred directly into the Air New Zealand Holidays Ltd bank account – see Entry Form for details.

Teams / Players: You may enter more than one team if you have sufficient players (15 per team). The entry fee will apply to each playing team entry.

Individuals: Individual entrants are also welcome and to play with a team of their choice or be allocated to a pool team. The entry fee for individual players is UKL15.

Cancellations and refunds of Team Entry fees:

When unforeseen circumstances force a team to withdraw after entering, a cancellation policy has been adopted for a refund. To be as fair as possible this is -

Up to December 31, 2007 - Full refund of the entry fee From January 01 to July 31, 2008 - 50% refund After July 31, 2008 - No refund

Please note: If a team cancels but some members still wish to attend and enjoy the Festival they will be welcome and can be merged with other sides.

conditions of entry

Completing the entry form and paying the entry fee means that you are deemed to have accepted the following conditions:

- The 17th Air New Zealand Golden Oldies World Rugby Festival (the 2008 Festival) is an invitation event and the Golden Oldies World Secretariat (World Secretariat) will only accept entries on this basis.
- 2. All players must be 35 years or older on 1 September 2008.
- All teams travelling by air must travel on Air New Zealand Limited's services or other approved Star Alliance or partner carrier(s). Details will be provided as entries are received.
- 4. All teams must complete a form listing all team members' names and addresses (whether players or supporters) once the entry has been accepted.
- 5. All entries will be subject to acceptance by the World Secretariat which reserves the write to decline or withdraw any entry at any time should it consider there is noncompliance with the "Conditions of Entry. If a team is so rejected, any refund of ground package payments will only be made in accordance with the event payment schedule and refund rules applying to all teams.
- The World Secretariat reserves the right to determine the maximum number of entries from any one country.
- 7. Entries will close on 31 May 2008 or at any other time at the discretion of the World Secretariat.
- 8. Entries will be accepted from clubs, groups or individuals who wish to form a Golden Oldies team.
- Participants normally resident in Scotland may purchase a local package. Other teams must purchase an accommodation package.
- 10. Residential addresses of local team members must be supplied if requested by the Secretariat.

- All teams must complete the official entry form, in this brochure and their appointed representative sign the Waiver, Release and Indemnification below.
- 12. Air New Zealand Holidays Limited reserves the right to change any venue of the 2008 Festival or any part thereof, including its removal to another country if it determines such a measure is necessary by reason of changes circumstances or conditions existing or anticipated at the 2008 Festival venue.
- 13. The World Secretariat collects participants' personal information in order to conduct the event. If the information requested is not provided the participant may not participate in the event. Please refer to Air New Zealand Limited's Privacy Policy at www.co.nz/privicy_policy.htm regarding the storage of personal information.
- 14. All players will be required to sign a waiver before the first round of games in Edinburgh.

No refund will be made if any portion of the 2008 Festival package if unused by the participant.

The passenger ticket when issued by the airline concerned shall constitute the sole contract between the Carrier concerned and the passenger and carriage by air will be subject to the actual carrier's Conditions of Carriage.
